

## **Bulcote Neighbourhood Plan Referendum Information Statement**

A Referendum relating to the adoption of the Bulcote Neighbourhood Plan will be held on Thursday 6 May 2021.

The question that will be asked in the Referendum is:

**‘Do you want Newark and Sherwood District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Bulcote to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?’**

The Referendum area is the same as the Bulcote Neighbourhood Area designated at the start of the Neighbourhood Plan process which is the whole parish of Bulcote. This is identified on Figure 1 within the Referendum Version of the Neighbourhood Plan which can be viewed through the link below.

A person is entitled to vote in the Referendum if on Monday 19 April 2021:

- He or she is entitled to vote in a local government election in the Referendum area; and
- His or her qualifying address for the election is in the Referendum area. A persons qualifying address is, in relation to a person registered in the electors, the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be registered.

The Referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the Referendum is £2,377.16. The number of persons entitled to vote in the Referendum by reference to which that limit has been calculated is 257.
